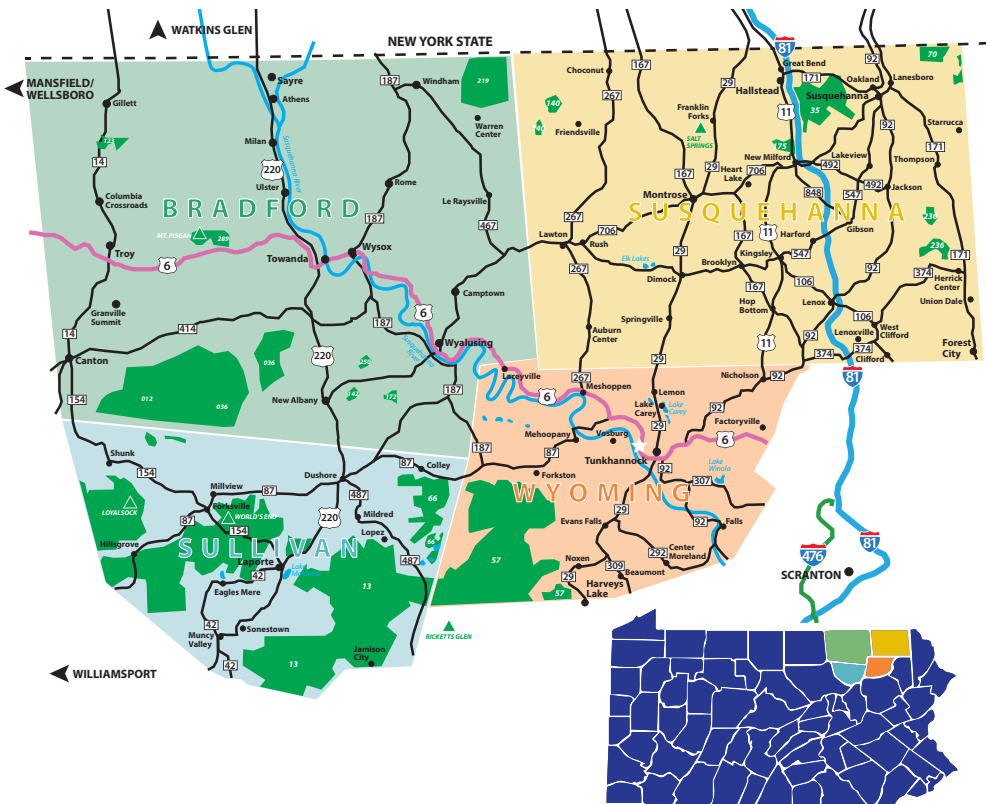

- 1 Bell Pepper or Banana Pepper
- 1 Can Cream of Chicken Soup
- 1 Cup Sour Cream

Directions:

Slice thinly zucchini, summer squash, onion and pepper and layer into a baking dish. Mix together Sour Cream and Cream of Chicken Soup and mix thoroughly. Combine vegetables and cream mixture until evenly mixed. Bake at 350 degrees until squash is tender.

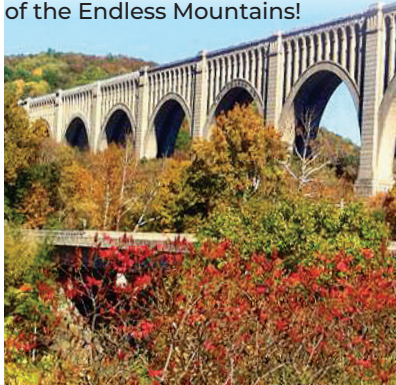
The PERFECT Time to Sample Homegrown Goodness

The foliage of the Endless Mountains offers some of the best fall drives in Pennsylvania! These suggested driving itineraries offer plenty of opportunities to stop and savor the best of the season.

220 **ROUTE 220** southbound from Sayre to Sullivan County offers everything a foliage tour could include from rolling farmlands through small towns and into some of Pennsylvania's beautiful forests. Stops to consider are farm markets and restaurants featuring seasonal favorites like apple dumplings and pumpkin pancakes to wineries stocked with fall blends. Check out the covered bridges and waterfall trails for added scenic enjoyment!

6 **PA ROUTE 6** offers birds eye views of regional farmlands and orchards as well as stops galore in towns like Towanda and Tunkhannock where farm markets and restaurants are the place to purchase locally harvested favorites. Right off Route 6 the many by-ways link local farm markets, wineries, microbreweries and restaurants specializing in locally produced products you will want to explore.

11 **ROUTE 11** from LaPlume to the New York State line near Hallstead not only features a popular scenic byway where you will see the infamous Tunkhannock Viaduct, but the route takes you through rich farmlands where locally grown fruits and vegetables are harvested and sold. The natural hops give the town of Hop Bottom it's iconic name which means a stop at the local breweries is a great place to sample local craft beverages and raise a glass of your favorite to the beautiful fall foliage of the Endless Mountains!



Recipe

Walnut-Crusted Roast with Blue Cheese Mashed Potatoes

Ingredients:

1 beef Eye of Round Roast (2 to 3 pounds)
Walnut Crust:
1/2 cup finely chopped walnuts
3 tablespoons finely chopped green onion
1/2 teaspoon pepper
4 cups prepared mashed potatoes, warmed
1/2 cup crumbled blue cheese

Cooking:

Heat oven to 325°F. Combine Walnut Crust ingredients; press evenly onto all surfaces of beef Eye of Round Roast. Place roast on rack in shallow roasting pan. Insert ovenproof meat thermometer so tip is centered in thickest part of beef. Do not add water or cover. Roast in 325°F oven 1-1/4 to 1-1/2 hours for medium rare doneness. (Do not overcook.) Remove roast when meat thermometer registers 135°F. Transfer roast to carving board; tent loosely with aluminum foil. Let stand 15 to 20 minutes. (Temperature will continue to rise about 10°F to reach 145°F for medium rare.) Meanwhile combine mashed potatoes and cheese in large bowl; keep warm.

Cook's Tip: Any type of prepared mashed potatoes may be used in this recipe: instant, refrigerated, frozen or homemade. Carve beef roast into thin slices; season with salt and pepper as desired. Serve with mashed potatoes.

Recipe

Backroad Creamery's Taco Mac n' Cheese

Ingredients:

- 1 lb ground hamburger, browned and drained
- 1 packet of taco seasoning - added to burger as directed on packet
- 2 cups elbow macaroni - cooked and drained
- 3 Tbsp butter
- 3 Tbsp flour
- 2 cups whole milk
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 9 oz (about 1 1/2 packs) of Backroad Creamery Queso de Taco cheese curds - coarsely chopped

Directions:

Melt butter over medium heat in sauce pan. Add flour to make a paste, stirring continuously. Add milk and stir until milk thickens, about 5 minutes. Add salt and pepper. Add cheese and stir until cheese melts. Add cheese mixture and beef to pasta. Bake at 350° for 20 minutes or until bubbly. Serve with sliced lettuce and tomatoes if you wish.

Head to the Endless Mountains to Discover

One of Nature's Sweetest Products

The tradition of tapping trees has been a practice on farms for generations across the region. Tapping trees consists of drilling a hole 1½ to 2" deep and inserting a plastic or steel spile. Each tap yields almost 10 gallons of sap which produces about a quart of syrup. Moderate to warm daytime temperatures and cold nights offer excellent conditions for sap flow, making the Endless Mountains an ideal location to produce maple products.

Maple season begins mid-February and runs 6 to 8 weeks. Maple syrup is heated and processed to produce popular products like Maple creams, sugars, and candies. It is also during this period when maple farms welcome visitors to experience the sweet rewards that come from this time-honored process.





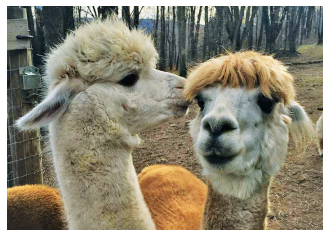

Combine ingredients in a small mixing bowl and stir well to combine.

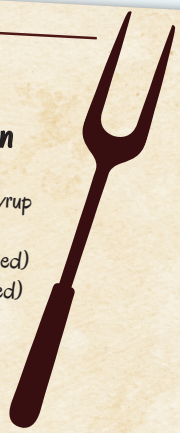
Preheat the oven to 400°F. Place the salmon on a baking sheet and then dress liberally with the glaze.
